

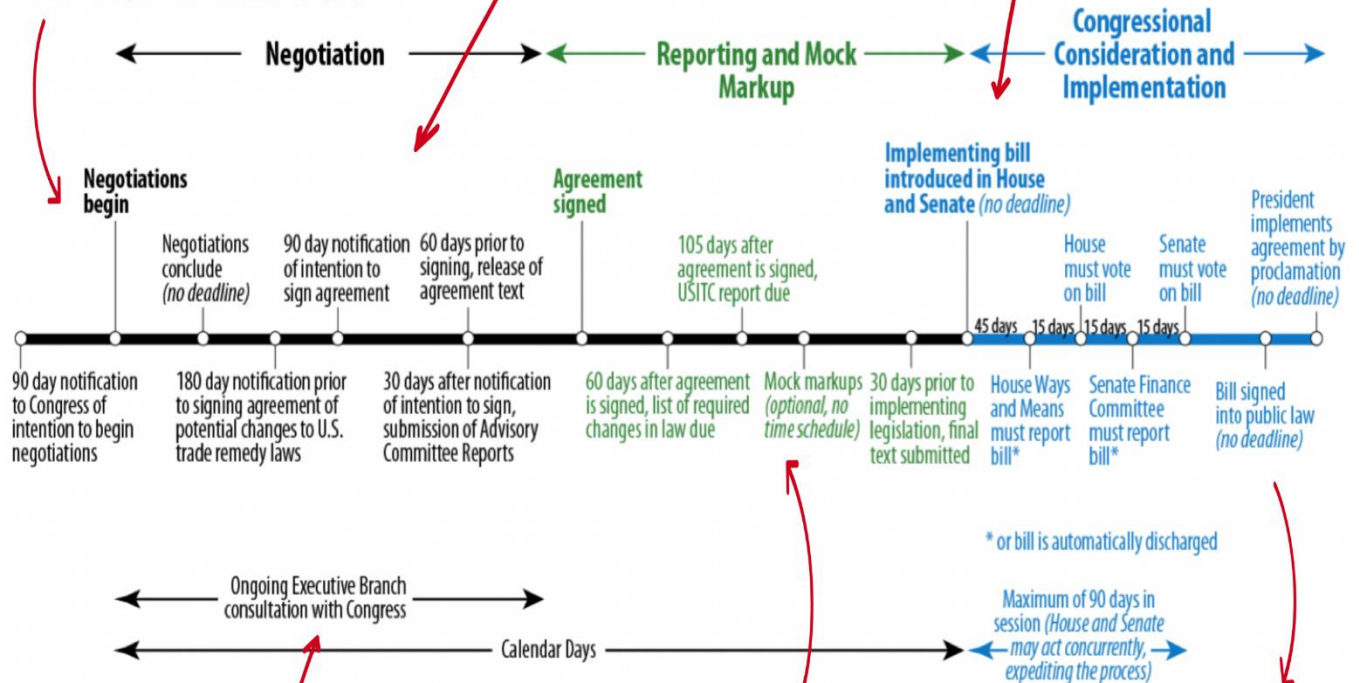
CONGRESSIONAL TIMELINE UNDER TPA



The "fast track" clock begins when the Executive sends an implementing package to the Congress. There's no set deadline. It's usually worked out between leadership in the branches. It must be on a day when Congress is in session.

Best practice is for the Administration to consult Members on its plans before this notification letter is sent.

In this 90-day period, it's Congress' "last chance" to review and provide into the deal before it's "done"



Key Hill staff are typically briefed before and after negotiating sessions.

Because the committees don't like to hold the mock markup without the ITC report, USTR often negotiates a compressed deadline for the report.

This sequence is usually worked out in advance and often does not require the full time allotted.
